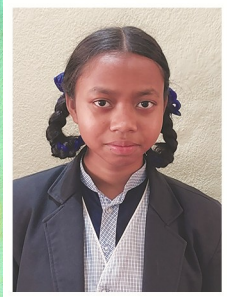

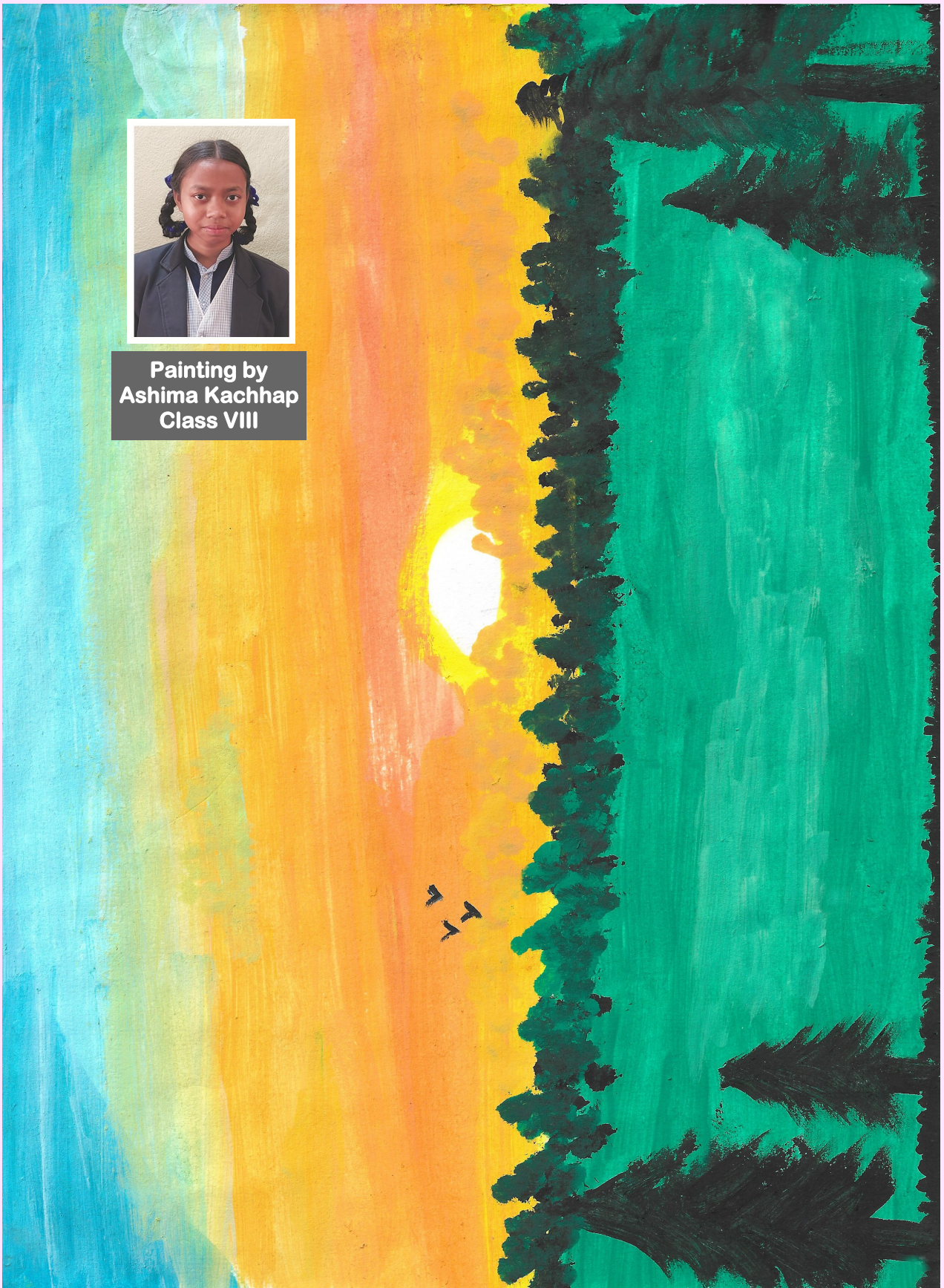

	How much you appreciate the things you have.

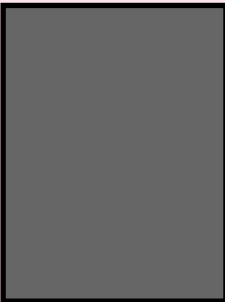

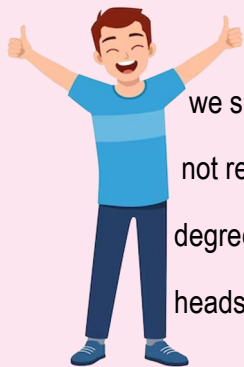

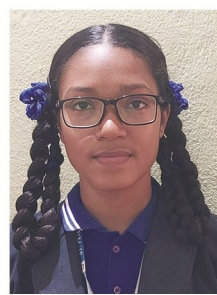

Intensive dance training program



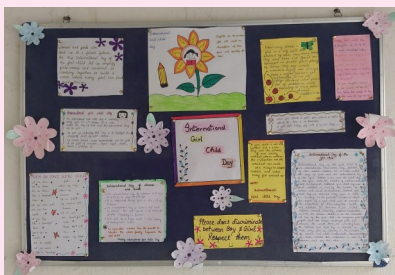

International Day of the Girl Child was celebrated at St. Peter School, Barikhajuri.



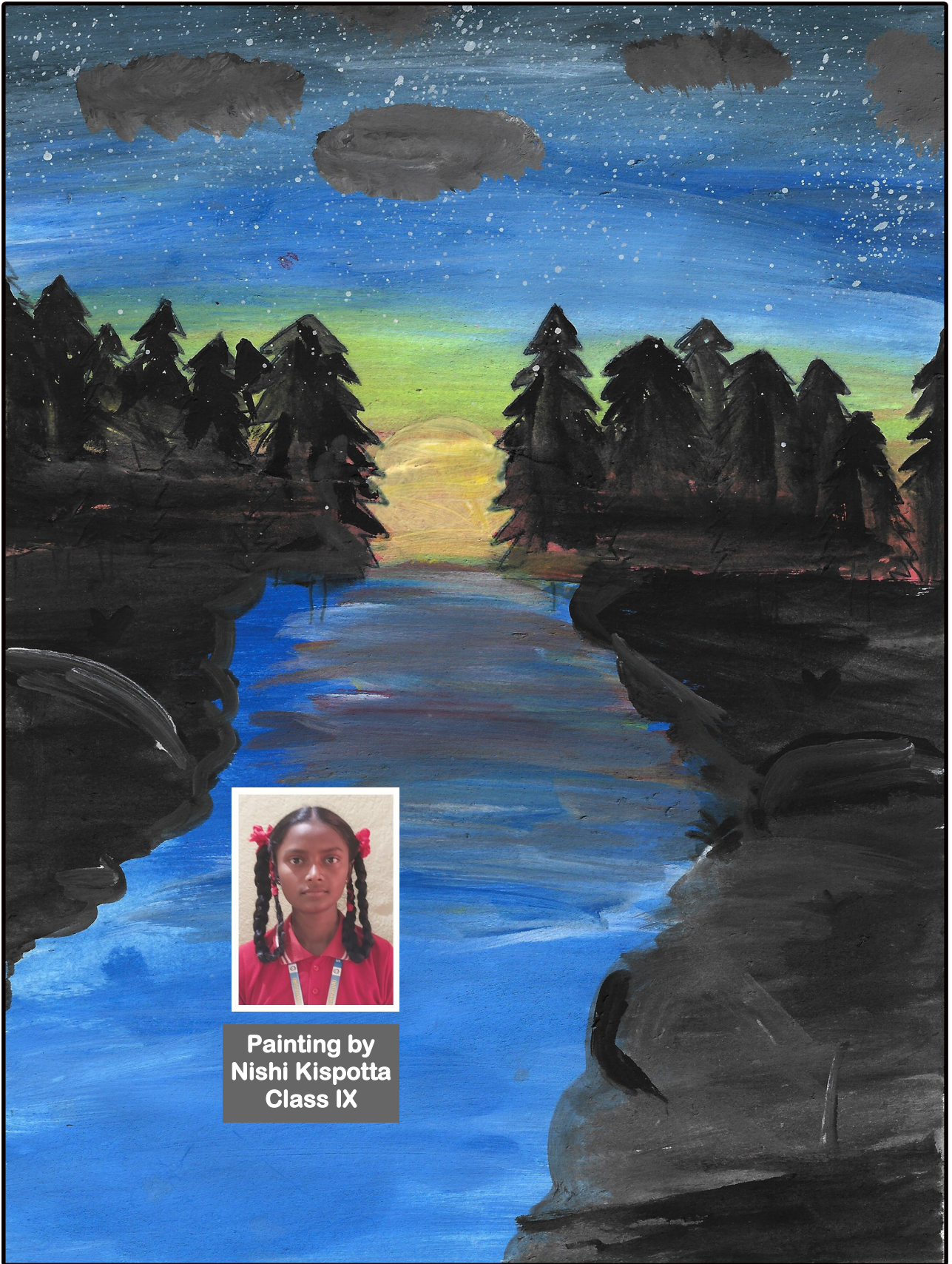

Solo song competition

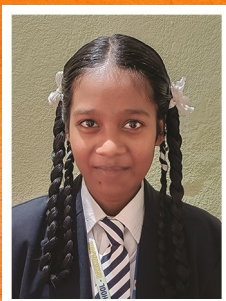
